Due to the current financial crisis in Brazil, government supported programs have been suspended. It is a sad and trying time for all....Through your generosity, we have succeeded








The Iona Mission Club also provided gifts for the sick and elderly in the immediate area.


If June does not yet find the Art Club members to be Michelangelo's or Picasso's, at least, they will have known the wonder of colour and lines and the thrill of creating.








