If June does not yet find the Art Club members to be Michelangelo's or Picasso's, at least, they will have known the wonder of colour and lines and the thrill of creating.





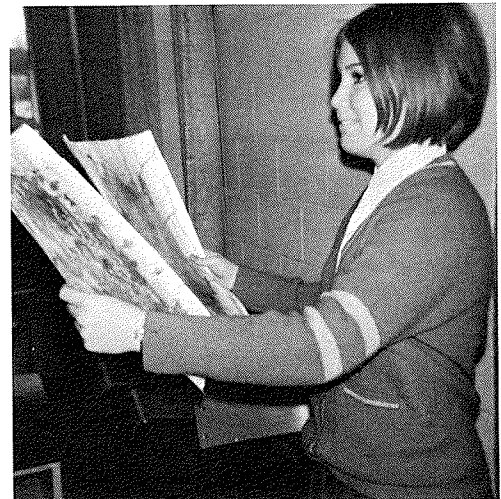
